Treasurer's Report

2015 was a successful year from a financial perspective. As a non-casino year our goal is to have a deficit. I am happy to report that we achieved our goal!

As can be seen in the financial report our 2015-16 revenues were exceeded by our expenses. Though that would not normally sound quite right, in our case it does. From a Waskahegan perspective, the majority of our revenue is casino revenue, which is meant to be spent on the needs of the Association. By far the majority of expenditures are related to trail upgrades, trail maintenance, and hiking activities. All of which our casino funds make happen.

Our annual membership revenue, though small, is the steady stream of income that pays for those annual costs that casino funds cannot finance. Taken together, these revenues successfully meet the needs of the Waskahegan Trail Association.

Attached to this report is the audited financial statement that show assets and liability, revenues and expenditures, and the balances of the Association.

My special thanks to JoAnne Burek, Sanjiv Thapar and Helen Whitson for their help in conducting the audit.

President's Report

At this time last year, we were on the path to an orderly recovery. After a few years of struggling with just five board members, declining membership, and difficulties with upkeep of trails, things were turning around. We had a slate of nine board members, our membership numbers were stabilizing, and we had a good system in place for trail maintenance. We continued to have a good year.

One of our priorities was the focus on recognizing our volunteers. Again we made our fall "volunteer" barbecue an event that was open to all members. We did this because we think ALL members should have the opportunity to recognize and thank our volunteers. Our volunteer participation has been outstanding, by the way. Last year, 30% of our members volunteered in some capacity. It reinforces the fact that there is a job here for almost everyone.

At the start of the year, we were still concerned with membership numbers. We knew that this trail would be valued by more people, if only they knew about it. So we did two things.

The obvious one was the major redesign of the website. We had been getting all kinds of questions about the trail, even very basic ones, to which the answers were found in the website, if you looked hard enough. Our new website platform has given us astounding flexibility compared to the old one. It's enabling us to add content, organize content, and schedule events much more easily. And we'll be able to work in all the search keywords used by people who should be coming to us, which will improve our reach.

The other thing we did, and it was finished even before the website, was the new brochure. Making a good brochure requires stepping back and examining who we are trying to appeal to, which means asking ourselves, "What do we actually have to offer people?"

And here's what we came to. Essentially we are reaching out to people who want to do an interesting day hike in the country without going far, and to people who want to do something fitness-wise with a purpose. You will see in the brochure that we focus on these two groups equally. You may be thinking that it's a bad thing to have a narrow focus, so I'll try to explain why it's a good thing. Besides telling everybody precisely what we offer, it informs people of new opportunities to do things they were not even aware of. If the brochure is successful, it will awaken them to thoughts about how much fun it would be to have more of these activities in their lives.

Going forward--the board will have its eye on the November 30th draw for a casino date. Our casino is likely to be in the summer of 2017. I hope you'll consider helping out. The more members we have volunteering, the more money we keep for ourselves. So as soon as the date is assigned, we'll announce it so you can put it on your calendars.

I would like to thank all the members who gave their time this year, and especially the board members, who I loved dearly for all their work, their support, and their good humour.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING APRIL 15 2016

We had access denied from a new owner on a property in the Fort Saskatchewan area. We are looking at ways to keep up on property changes that are unknown to us. Email returns and newsletter returns are typically how we learn about these changes.

We have a land owner concerned about hikers wandering through his property unannounced as he has an air soft activity course. I assured him that we are on a hike schedule 2 times a year and that we would not be wandering around. I suggested that he can look at our schedule on the newsletter that I sent him. I am still in the process of gathering some of the particulars to see how to proceed from there.

We have collected 37 email addresses so far from land owners. This is an ongoing process that we will keep working on going forward.

We get a few newsletter returns each spring and fall. It just a matter of contacting them and updating emails or addresses.

In closing, we must continue to support the land owners and be grateful to be able to hike their land.

Trail Maintenance 2015 Season

- -This past season we made a huge difference in taming most areas of the trail. We built a new stile and mended Low's bridge. The equipment shed has had some organizing done. Crews were out for 36 times in 7 months.
- -This year I plan for less frequency and bigger crews going out.
- -To do that we need more people out for maintenance. It does tend to be the same people coming out.
- -If you are interested please come and put your name on my list so I can send you the latest schedule. You can also check the website to see where we are working next. That way you can decide to come last minute.
- -Trail maintenance jobs include mowing, weed eating, chain sawing, clipping, signing and clearing debris as well as building stiles and boardwalks. Details for each work party are on the website.
- -We are still looking for a workshop which would enable a more shared system of maintenance where minor things like sharpening, gas, & wood cutting can be done by various people. The equipment can be organized and repaired and we can store a supply of cut wood ready for stiles and boardwalks.
- -We are also looking for trail maintenance people that have a vehicle with a hitch or a truck that could be used for transportation of equipment.
- -This season we hope to clear the trail not done last year.
- -We also need to build boardwalks in the Ross Creek area.
- -We are in the initial stages of an agreement with the Military Engineers to build a bridge where Ross Creek is flooded the worst. Likely this will happen next year. To help with that added expense for the wood we will be applying for a grant.
- -Thank you to all the volunteers that made trail maintenance happen last year.

Newsletter Report

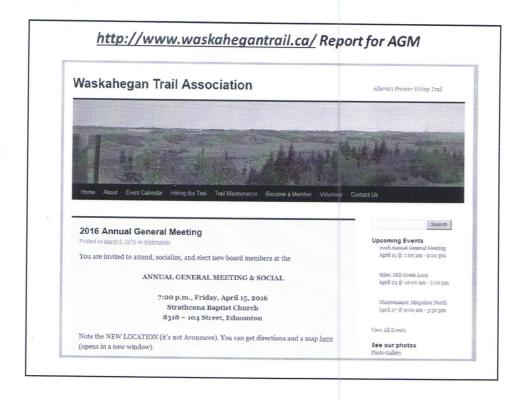
Spring 2016

- New web site went live last Friday (April 8th)
 - In working on the "clean up" the content that I referenced last year we quickly came to the conclusion that the limitations on what we can do with the was a hindrance
 - Recently updated the 'announcements' on the front page so same content for all logins (public, member, volunteer)
- The old site is still active (7 available at http://wta.waskahegantrail.ca
 - Largely because it was paid for up until the fall, so we setup the new site at the minimum (cheapest) options
 - Using the old site for the photos & membership database
 - But we will likely even eliminate those in the fall rather than renew
 - Move the membership database to a spreadsheet, as we are not that big
 - Move the photos to something like Flickr (some restrictions) or increase the storage options with the hosting provider & put the photos there (would still be ~2/3rd of what we had been paying)
 - The new site though expands our ability to have new posts, synchronize the calendar with our members personal calendars, get feed back from members & the general public
 - We are also looking at adding online payment from PayPal
 - While we'll lose a few \$\$ on the membership payments, adding that convenience may get us a few new members or renewals which would offset the expense but not increase our operating costs
 - You'd need a PayPal account to use it ... we are not big enough to offer multiple
 payment options and PayPal offers the greatest flexibility, as you can link your
 PayPal account to a credit card rather than setting up credit card payment

A change we made this winter was going back to scheduling hikes every two weeks instead of weekly, for several reasons. For one thing, it's hard to find enough leaders in the winter months. For another, it's

often pointless trying to plan winter hikes up to six months in advance—besides blizzards and extreme cold, we are increasingly getting warm spells which cause treacherously icy conditions almost overnight. Finally, we stay mainly to the Edmonton city trails, and there are so many walking clubs and meetups, it's very easy to find a group to go with on almost any day at all.

We are always looking for more leaders to help share the schedule. We were delighted to add new hike leaders to our team—Kirsten Newman, Irene Malcolm, and Gladys Vogel—and I thank them for joining us. I would also like to thank all the rest of the volunteers who consistently help out every year.
