

Waskahegan Trail Guidebook - Corrections and Updates

Page 48: The footbridge at Low's Crossing was removed in 2017. Take the optional route out to A58.

Page 50: A portion of the trail between D and E is closed except with express permission. Contact information@waskahegantrail.ca for more information.

Page 51: Trail closed between D and E except with permission

Page 53: Next to A64, the road is TWP 462, not 461.

Page 56: Starting at the last sentence of the second last paragraph: :

If the route along the railway is closed, strike up a "goat path", and use an open area beside a fence as your way out to the old ski hill **operation on the Oscar Trail of Camrose Mountain Bike Trails. Follow the bike trails to Point C. You will see a map of the Camrose Mountain Bike Trails that indicate the way to Stoney Creek Camrose ski trails and onward to Camrose.**

At Point C, you will find a skidoo route going down into the valley. In the valley, stay low and you'll soon be on ski trails, After you pass under the impressive Highway 13A bridge, you come to asphalt trails. Soon you spot the Camrose Ski Clubhouse. Farther on at A70 there are picnic shelters. A71 is the Bill Fowler Centre (see the next section).

Page 59: Along HWY 13/48 Ave, the first road south on the east side of the creek should be 50 St., not 59 St. The road north from HWY 13A to get to A69/Liberty Village sign (unmarked in the book) is 39 Ave.

Page 73: Erosion is a problem in the Muskeg area. Trail Maintenance will create a trail around the north side of the muskeg but it may take some time. As you approach the mossy area, watch for new trail markers or just avoid the area.

Page 78: Last paragraph

Walk along Wye Road passing a part of Hastings tight against the road. **At A94 walk along RR202 until you reach our trail marker beside gate entrance of Allen Nature Trails. Call Mr. or Mrs. Allen (780 462-3991 or Jeff's cell 587-589-3719) before you enter on their trails.**

Please, no parking on Wye Road beside this entry. The Allens want the entry to be kept low-key. The winding path slows you down so you can enjoy the vegetation, the birds and a bit of Hastings Lake (Historical Note p. 80). When you exit, you are a few steps north of St. Margaret's Church (see Notes, page 137).

Alternatively continue walking along Rge Rd. 202 until you reach first intersecting road. Turn left to walk short distance to St. Margaret's Church (see page 137) and Allen Bay beyond.

Page 100-101: Trappers Lake Section is closed.

Page 104: Go east starting at A111 as the section from A111 west towards A112 is closed. A109 has been moved. It is on Range Road 214 (not Township Road 540).

Page 105: The Trail from Range Road 212 to 210 is closed temporarily. You could walk the road beside Elk Island Park, off Twp 540, and enter to Trappers Lake trail from there. The hike along Trappers Lake is only about 2 km one way on this shortened portion.
